Wine gastonomic experiences

Some typical dishes to taste

Risotto all'amarone: it combines two of the most renowned ingredients of the area: Vialone nano rice and Amarone della Valpolicella.

Bigoli con le sarde: they are fresh egg pasta that resembles spaghetti, with a diameter of about 4-5 mm with sardine fish.

Risotto al Tastasal: it is a word from the Verona dialect which means "to taste the salt" and is basically pork minced, with salt and pepper.

Gnocchi di patate: is a typical dish, it occupies a special place in the heart of the Veronese.

Lesso e pearà: boiled meat and vegetables served with a sauce (pearà) made from breadcrumbs with pepper, cheese, broth.

Patissada de caval: ancient dish of the sixteenth century based on horse meat, wine, aromas, often accompanied by polenta.

Pandoro: is a naturally leavened soft cake made with flour, eggs, sugar and butter.
